As of August 1<sup>st</sup>, IDVA has received and processed 1,554 applications for the second Vietnam Bonus Program. The average bonus amount awarded is \$178.52, with 1,036 (66.67%) applications awarded a bonus. To date IDVA has distributed \$184,950.50. ~

## Iowa Veterans Cemetery Dedication

After years of planning and many months of construction, the Iowa Veterans Cemetery is dedicated and open!

On July 3, 2008 an estimated 1,000 veterans and their families traveled to Van Meter, Iowa to witness the dedication ceremony.

Prior to the dedication, dignitaries representing the Iowa congressional delegation, state legislators, veteran service organizations, government officials and other veteran interest groups toured the facility.

Although it was a little warm, the weather finally cooperated after rain and snow had severely handicapped construction progress throughout the winter and spring months.

The ceremony began with the presentation of colors by a Joint Color Guard, the National Anthem by the 34<sup>th</sup> Iowa Army Band and vocalist SMG Barrett, and an F-16 flyover by the Iowa Air National Guard, 132<sup>nd</sup> Fighter Wing.

Members of the Knapp and Kenyon families were invited to speak, followed by Senators Grassley and Harkin, and Congressmen Latham, Boswell, and King. Scott Gebhardtshauer represented the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, State Cemetery Grant Program, and former Governor Tom Vilsack provided additional comments. Governor Chet Culver presented the keynote address.

Following Governor Culver's address, the cemetery was dedicated and blessed by Chaplain, CPT Jeffrey Farr. The dedication concluded with a service medley, a 21-gun salute, and taps.

Following the dedication, guests were invited to tour the Administration Building and enjoy refreshments, or participate in the unveiling of the Fallen Heroes Monument. This monument was donated to the Cemetery by the Ames chapter of Beta Sigma Phi, an international women's sorority. This is a memorial to the soldiers and sailors who have given their lives during the course of Operation Iraqi Freedom and Operation Enduring Freedom.

Another addition to the grounds is a bronze eagle, donated by the Iowa National Guard Officers Auxiliary, and placed a few days before the dedication. It is located in front of the columbarium walls.

Another recent addition to the cemetery is a memorial from the Military Order of the Purple Heart (*below*). This monument is found on the memorial walk heading toward the National flag pole. ~

The free event begins at 9 a.m. and ends at 1 p.m. Join us for resources, military women health information, and a motivational speaker.

The lively speaker is Elizabeth "Betty" Wall. Her fascinating story is as one of our nation's "Fly Girls." During the years 1934-1944, the Women Air Force Service Pilots (WASPs) of WWII flew every P-47 off the factory line in 1944, flying over 60,000,000 miles of operational flights and 77 different types of military aircraft including the B-29. ## Indigent Veteran Burial

A recent *Des Moines Register* article outlined the "Missing in America Project," a group dedicated to identifying the unclaimed remains of America's veterans. So far they have identified one Iowa veteran, who was laid to rest at the Iowa Veterans Cemetery on August 25<sup>th</sup>.

IDVA has also contacted the Iowa Funeral Home Association to identify unclaimed veteran remains. Although, no remains were brought to our attention, we applaud the efforts of the "Missing in America Project" in helping Iowa veterans rest in peace.

The Iowa Veterans Cemetery is an excellent resource for Iowa counties charged with indigent veteran burial. Since there is no fee for veterans, counties need only bear the cost of cremation. Feel free to contact the cemetery with any questions related to this subject at 515-996-9048. ~

## Lottery Tickets for Veterans

July was a very busy month for veterans and IDVA. Just a few days following the opening of the Iowa Veterans Cemetery, the Iowa Lottery unveiled the new lottery tickets that benefit the Iowa Veterans Trust Fund.

The outdoor event was held on Camp Dodge at the Gold Star Museum, with military equipment as a fitting background.

The main author of the legislation, Representative McKinley Bailey (D - Webster City), was present to address the crowd, as was John Derner from the American Legion and Patrick Palmersheim, Executive Director of the Iowa Department of Veterans Affairs. Speakers stressed the importance of providing assistance to all veterans while recognizing the sacrifices made by military families serving in the Global War on Terror.

Lottery proceeds are collected quarterly, so the Trust Fund should receive its first deposit in the coming months. It is anticipated that once fully implemented, the tickets will annually generate approximately \$3 million to the Trust Fund.

Every ticket sold contains IDVA's 800 number (1-800-vet-iowa) for veterans to call for veteran benefit information. ~

## County Office Hours and Accreditation Requirements

New legislation goes into effect July 1, 2009, requiring each county to have a veterans affairs office that employs a person providing veteran affairs services, benefits, and information for a minimum amount of hours as follows:

- Counties with a population of 30,000 or less - 20 hours per week
- Counties with a population of 30,001 to 60,000 - 30 hours per week
- Counties with a population of 60,001 or greater - 40 hours per week

The law change also requires counties to have an Executive Director or Administrator certified by IDVA as being accredited by the National Association of County Veteran Service Officers (NACVSO). NACVSO accreditation is a requirement of employment for the Executive Director or Administrator. The Executive Directors or Administrators will also be required to have email, internet, and general computer training.

IDVA will be providing a School of Instruction in October of 2009. NACVSO will be contracted to provide accreditation training and continuing education requirements for accreditation. This school will take place in Des Moines and schools will be held at least annually to allow county staff to maintain accreditation.

In anticipation of the costs associated with this new law, the legislature provided a \$10,000 allotment that will be given to each county to pay for the increased hours or for training.

Since the law does not take effect for another ten months, IDVA is working with the Commission and counties to have draft rules available for the county school this October. A letter will be sent out to County Boards of Supervisors outlining the law change and to inform them of the funding attached to the new law. ~
